*Non-Degree Seeking



Overview

The Ritsumeikan Summer Japanese Program (RSJP) and Ritsumeikan Winter Japanese Program (RWJP) are designed for undergraduate or graduate students with minimal knowledge of the Japanese language, providing a comprehensive introduction to Japanese language and culture. RSJP and RWJP programs consist of two major components. Participants are enrolled in an intensive Japanese language class which provides them with a through introduction to the language. Students also participate in Japan Studies classes to learn about Japanese culture and take part in field excursions.

We have 5-week RSJP/RWJP programs and also 2-week “Express” programs in summer and winter.

Japanese Language

Japanese Language classes are conducted for 150-minute every weekday morning, maintaining a general balance between conversation, reading, and writing, with goal of improving overall communication skills. Lectures in class will focus on topics such as business, history, society and traditional culture to gain an understanding of the finer aspects of Japanese culture. Program participants will create a strong foundation for their future studies of Japanese through these lessons.

- Improve Japanese proficiency in all four skills in a well-balanced (Speaking/Listening/Writing/Reading)



Japan Studies/Culture

Japan Studies classes are held two to three times a week. In addition to the lectures on Japanese culture held in the Japanese language classes, participants are given the opportunity to take part in various fieldwork excursions and receive special lectures on Japanese culture from masters who are well respected in their field in order to reinforce what they have learnt.

Ritsumeikan BUDDY

Buddies from Ritsumeikan University will be here for you to support your life at Ritsumeikan. It will not be a 1-on-1 system but they will assist you in groups by speaking only in Japanese for you to fully immerse in the Japanese language. You will have opportunity to interact directly with local students and practice Japanese and learn about Japanese culture such as recent Japanese pop culture, trending words, anime, and many other topics. You might also be able to find life-long friends.



Accommodation

You will have the option to stay at the International House TAISHOGUN or book accommodation on your own (must be within Kyoto city).

- Able to communicate in English or in basic Japanese.
- Master Hiragana and Katakana before the program starts.

*Students who already hold a Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) N1 qualification are not eligible to participate.

(2) Prepare documents

- Handwritten Essay in Japanese
- Official Enrollment and Transcript ready
- Passport (COPY)
- Medical Form from your doctor (Only for 5-week Program)
- Signed Letter of Consent

Participants will be placed into classes depending on the information given in their application and essay written in Japanese. On the first day of Japanese Language Class, they will take a placement test in the class.
